- ❖ 2019 has been another challenging year for the hall.

There are still issues to address with regards to up-dating the Hire Agreement and deposit. Although this has been discussed on numerous occasions at Parish Council meeting nothing as far as I am aware has been implemented. I am aware that there is a conflict of interest with two Councillors, but this needs to be dealt with and agreed as soon as possible to allow us to update the web-site.

- ❖ The dykes have been in danger of flooding the hall over the last month, due to the heavy rainfall. Many thanks to Stephen Parker for getting his men to deal with it. The water is vastly reduced and seems to be draining away.

- ❖ The sewer from the hall was backing up on New Years Eve. Many thanks to Billy and Mick Baldes for sorting this out and clearing it on New Years day. A set of rods have been put in the Container and I would like permission to order another set as longer ones are needed. The drains and sewer pipes need to be looked at in the spring as discussed with Stephen Parker.

- ❖ The New Years party was a great success with forty plus people attending. Hopefully this will be something that we can host every year.

- ❖ This years Pantomime was also a great success with record audiences and we achieved our target of over £2,000. I am hopeful that we can encourage others to join us this year with a workshop in the spring.

❖ Lastly I would like permission to purchase a dishwasher for the hall. This would be most helpful for residents who put on large functions as I know that the washing up can be quite daunting when you have over 40 people for Christmas dinner.
